It is too bad that there was no room for an essay on the role of teaching English and history in the classrooms created by the new Education acts, as it seems that history, coupled with Henry Newbolt's poetry, Matthew Arnold's work in general, as well as the later work of John Masefield, John Buchan, and "Sapper" had something to do with driving the concept of Englishness. However, those are quibbles. My suggestions would make this work into two volumes and would have probably prevented its publication. The very good work on language, music (the material on Elgar is outstanding), and other matters make this an important book.

It is remarkable that the concept of Englishness grew from the rural English world, just as that world went into its most severe decline. Was it a revolution waiting to happen long before it occurred? In fact, does it occur in reaction to the growth of the empire as the literate population also grows and democracy, in some forms, extends itself downward into the lower middle and even the working classes? In other words, does the growth of the concept of "Englishness" occur because it was to the benefit of those in control of the governments of the time, or is it simply fortuitous. Perhaps this is the point that Stephen Yeo was struggling with in his opaque essay. In any case, few who teach in English literature, politics, history, and allied subjects will not learn much from this very good book.

Roger Geary. *Policing Industrial Disputes: 1893-1985*. New York: Cambridge University Press. 1985. Pp. vii, 171. \$34.50.

Roger Geary squarely hits the target when he claims that his book "plug(s) up a gap in the existing literature—somewhat surprisingly there has been comparatively little research on policing in general let alone the policing of industrial disputes" (p. 2). It is quite true; although there have been several studies of violence, no study of it in a single type of event (such as strikes) is available. Furthermore, there are no studies that trace in such detail, as Geary's book does, the relationship between industrial conflict, policing, and violence in historical perspective; of particular interest is the relationship between police tactics and likelihood of violence: certain police tactics of crowd control, in fact, (e.g. the deployment of riot shields in the 1980s) are shown to be conducive to confrontation and violence (p. 143).

The main goal of the book is to extract a general pattern of police control of strikes (or more generally disorder) over the past 100 years in Great Britain; its empirical base is the historical material available on a few selected violent strikes, and interviews of police officers and union representatives for the more recent period. The research results point to a general shift from "traditional to rational, from informal to formal policing during the last fifty years or so" (p. 133); more specifically, at the strategic level there has occurred a centralization of order maintenance and intelligence gathering while, at the tactical level, there has been a progressive shift to less violent methods of crowd control from shooting by the army in early times, to baton-charges, to cordons, wedges, and snatch squads; only the recent adoption in the 1980s of the short-shields, truncheons, and baton-charging the crowd at speed has reversed this historic trend.

The re-emergence of prolonged and bitter industrial violence during the miners' dispute prompted many onlookers to speculate that British society was.
